### Grade Recovery

A student earning a D or an F on the report card may be eligible for grade recovery. Forms must be picked up in the main office and taken to the classroom teacher to determine eligibility no later than 2 days after report cards have been sent home. Participation in the grade recovery process is not a vested right and does not guarantee a grade change. Mastery of the first quarter skills and content is required for a grade change.
